

# ARF Honor Roll

## Richard "Dick" Henzel

Dick Henzel, Klamath Falls, joined the ARF Board in 1949 and served on the board for the next 44 years. He managed Tulana Farms, one of the Klamath Basin's largest farming operations with up to 34,000 acres in 1947. He was active in many civic affairs. He was President of the Malin Chamber of Commerce and served on the boards of the Klamath County Chamber of Commerce, Merle West Medical Center, First National Bank, and the Klamath Drainage District. He helped form the Klamath Basin Water Users Protective Association and was instrumental in the development of Malin Park. He was a lifetime member of the Elks and Rotary clubs of Klamath Falls, a Rotary Club Paul Harris Fellow, and a member of the First United Methodist Church of Klamath Falls. He served on the advisory committee of the Oregon State University (OSU) Klamath Basin Experiment Station (KES).



Dick had a strong interest in research. In the early 1960s, given concerns about poor crop growth on some of the muck soils in the Klamath Basin, Tulana Farms donated more than 65 acres of muck land to KES. Work by KES scientist showed that minor element nutrient deficiencies were a problem and solutions were found. Dick grew oats in his Klamath operation and encouraged research not only on oat production but on the nutritional and health value of human consumption of oats. He was a strong proponent of cross-disciplinary research during his many years with ARF.



Dick graduated from Oregon Agricultural College (OAC; now OSU) in 1931 with a degree in Agricultural Engineering. He played baseball for OAC as an outfielder and was a member of the national honor military society Scabbard and Blade. Dick was a life-long supporter of OSU. Through

the years, he gave over \$235,000 to the OSU Foundation to support sports, music, cheerleading, 4H, and academic programs. Dick was honored with the OSU Distinguished Service Award in 1972 and was inducted into the OSU College of Agricultural Sciences Hall of Fame in 1981. He also won the Congressional Medallion award for the Northwest in 1967.

Henzel left the board in 1993 and died in 1997 at the age of 88.
